

Jamie asked if Eric would be in addition to Travis Parman. Mr. Buchs stated that Travis would like to be the Varsity Assistant and Eric would be the JV Assistant. Jamie also asked if a parent complete/issue would happen with boys' basketball that they would share the issue with the board. Brandon and Beau both said that they would be open to notifying the board if needed. Brandon would like to keep the chain consistent. Dana said that the administration team would let the board know if anything needs to be shared with the board. BJ asked what happens when someone resigns with a signed contract. The district has had a few teachers back out of the contract and the school is left with starting the hiring process again. Mr. Buchs stated that the contract listed on the personnel transaction sheet has not been signed. Denise looked up the process in the handbook and updated the board. Pete said that it might be worth looking into what other schools do.

Kim stated that she would like to abstain from appointment #7.

BJ asked if appointment #4 could be voted separately.

### V. DISCUSSION ITEMS

### A. AGR Report

Mrs. Bendorf and Mrs. Brania presented the report. There has been huge growth in kindergarten who was using a Pilot program. Laura asked Mrs. Bendorf to explain what the goal is. As a district, we look at the students moving from tier 3 upward. BJ asked if we could follow the classes all the way through to see what the progress over time is. Pete said that looking at the report he can see that our teachers and students are making great progress from Fall to Spring.

B. Update of Summer School

Mr. Buchs stated that we have had students working hard in credit recovery. We also have a big group of students who are attending other summer school classes. A group of students were able to go to the Belmont Mound State Park and the Heinrich's property. Mr. Buchs would like to thank the Summer School Staff.

C. Budget Update

Mr. Buchs stated that we are still waiting for the approval of the State Budget from the Government. He is working on this year's budget, and we are over in some of the areas. There are many factors that need to be adjusted. The draft is a work in progress. He is hopeful that the Joint Finance committee and Legislature will approve the increases the district needs. He is hoping to have a more accurate draft budget next month. Pete asked if there was anything that we have done for years that could be looked at and revamped

budget-wise. Pete asked if we could look at the 'in leu of' piece of insurance. The district has three sets of couples on staff that are more than likely receiving health insurance and the in leu of benefit. Pete is wondering if the district should look into the amount of the in lieu of insurance the school is paying for spouses in the district. Mrs. Bendorf stated that it would be hard to segregate spouses from other staff members who choose not to take the insurance. Pete would like to look at the dollar amount given to the staff that take the in lieu of benefit. Jamie stated that we need to study the data to see if we are saving money. BJ stated that he would like to see if other districts are one or one or if they use a multiplier on the value. Vaughn remembers that when the district first looked into the in lieu of benefit, they found that the way it is set up was the best at the time. BJ stated that since it has been ten years, maybe this is something the district should look into again.


