

I. CALL TO ORDER

Vice President Lauren Runde called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

D. Principal

Mrs. Bendorf prepared a written report. Mrs. Bendorf would like to give a staff shout out to Matt Bockhop for setting up 6th grade student meetings with teachers. Also, Mr. Lehnherr and Mrs. Edge on the amazing programs. Kim asked what was considered pre-truant? Mrs. Bendorf said students with 3-5 absences are considered pre-truant. BJ thanked Mrs. Bendorf for looking into truancy. Jamie stated that attendance for elementary students should possibly be looked at differently than high school students. Younger students seem to be sick more than older students. It is hard to have the same rules for all students. BJ asked if the district sees higher rates in high school or elementary. Mrs. Bendorf stated that most of our absences are in high school students.

E. Superintendent

Mr. Buchs prepared a written report. The heating problem in the commons was a valve that was bad. It is fixed now and running. The village tax bills were sent out. He also talked about the school tax credit. He also gave a Financial Literacy and an Act 20 update.

The district is required to review the plan and turn it into the DOJ. Belmont Police and County Police came and toured the school to inspect and help with the plan. We will need to number each interior door and all exterior doors and windows.

E. Approval of 2024-25 School Calendar

Spring Break has been moved back a week. Thanksgiving has been corrected. The staff has had a chance to view the calendar and have not presented any concerns. We will be doing some jump start days again next year. Lauren asked how many snow days are factored in? Mr. Buchs stated that 5 days have been added to the calendar.

F. Approval of 2024-25 High School Coursebook

Mr. Wolch presented the Course Offering List. He stated that the new courses that were started this year have been going great. He would also like to start a Senior Project.

Seniors would have to complete a 20-hour service project. He would like to meet with this year's junior students and families to explain. Mr. Buchs would like to thank the staff for taking a serious look at the coursebook and Mr. Wolch for organizing and working with Administration on making sure there are good opportunities for our students.

VI. Discussion Items

A. Scoreboards in Gyms

The elementary gym scoreboard is not consistently working at the moment. Mound City bank has agreed to sponsor a scoreboard and will donate \$5,500. There is a possible community member that is willing to donate also. Mr. Buchs is also reaching out to Kwik Trip to see if they would like to sponsor it also. BJ would like to have a further discussion on labeling sponsorships on individual items or listing the sponsorships in one location. Laura asked about the new tv type scoreboards. Mr. Buchs stated that the recommended board would meet all of our needs at this time.

B. Need for Future Operating Referendum

Mr. Buchs has been projecting numbers for future budgets and believes we will need to look at an operating referendum in November 2024. Every school district in CESA 3 has reported that they either have passed an operational referendum, or they will be running on within the next year to year and a half. This is due to the State not giving us funding increases the previous two years. Inflation happened at the same time, which has doubled

our problem keeping up with funding. He would like to work with Baird to ensure we look at what we really need to ask for and not to ask for unnecessary funds from our taxpayers. He stated that last year we were \$229,149 over budget. We have the fund balance to sustain this for a few years but cannot continue in the long term without more revenue. The state pulled increased in 2020-2021 which would have resulted in us having around \$900/pupil over the two years. This stopped over \$320,000 that would be in our budget that would help meet our needs but now we are behind on funding. BJ stated that maybe the district could come up with a list of items that might be cut to show community members what might happen if we do not get more funding.
