Mr. Hodgson asked to take the van with 5-8 students. It is an overnight trip and needs to be approved by the board. Pete asked to have a backup plan in place, just in case COVID changes plans. Mr. Buchs stated that it would be discussed.

A. Daycare Research Update

Mr. Buchs stated that the committee met and is working on a survey to send to parents and possibly the community on need. They would like to look at the data from the survey to make decisions on how we will proceed. Kim stated that they talked about setting up a meeting with the local daycares to get their opinions on the needs.

B. 2022-2023 Covid Protocols

Mr. Buchs met with the Health Department. The preliminary information is that if a student is positive, they will stay home for 5 days. If a student is sick, they need to stay home. The Health Department and school are trying to get back to the 24-hour rule of if you have a fever or have gotten sick, the student stays home for a minimum of 24 hours. If there is an outbreak, masks might be considered again. The school district does not need to contract trace.

C. Update on Facility Projects

The companies that are currently working on the baseball field project would like to have work wrapped up shortly. The weightroom painting is almost complete. Rubber flooring will be laid down in the weightroom and the rooms will be rearranged. The custodial team has done a great job of getting the school ready for students. The generator was inspected, and the cooling system is not working correctly. Tom is working on getting more information and possible quotes on repair or replacing. The clear touch panels have been installed and ready to use. There are 7-9 more classrooms that will need to be updated with the panels.

I. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- 1. Pavilion near Football/Baseball Field: BJ Galle drew up a plan for a pavilion that would be adjacent to the outdoor concession stand and near the athletic fields. Susie Gill has expressed interest in donating towards this project. The plan was reviewed and the group was comfortable with pursuing prices on a 12'x24' pavilion. Mr. Buchs shared that some grants have been applied for to help assist with upgrading the restrooms, adding sidewalks, and to help pay for the pavilion. The goal of this is to make the grounds more accessible for all people including those who may have physical disabilities.
- 2. Update on Outdoor Projects: The baseball field is under construction and the Droesslers will be here this week to build the blocks on the dugout, Rural will be building the retaining wall at the base of the hill, and fencing will be done as soon as this is done. Lastly, the final grade swill be put on the field and the cement will be finished once everyone else is ready. Todd Barrett will aim to be here sometime during the week of August 29th to build the dugout roofs.
- 3. Update on Paint for Exterior Gym Door: Livesey Painting out of Madison came today, August 22nd, to prep and paint the exterior doors of the HS gym where the paint had all peeled off.
- 4. Update on Weightroom Project: Thanks to many great volunteers, the weight room was painted. Another group of volunteers will help lay the rubber floor in the room as well. Mr. Buchs also would like to thank the Booster Club for funding this project. Again, the classrooms below will no longer have to hear the noise from the weights during PE classes.
- 5. Other: BJ asked Tom if we had heard back on any other quotes for the library door hardware. Tom reported that these locks are obsolete, and we have had a long journey of searching for parts. The best solution may be to purchase completely new hardware for these doors.
- III. Adjourn: BJ motioned, Pete seconded to adjourn at 6:45 PM. Motion passed 3-0.

Adding Absence Requests in Skyward Family Access

If your student is staying home from school, you can create an absence request in Skyward Family Access the morning of the absence. If you know your student will not be in school on a future date (ex. family vacation), you can create an absence request for a future date as well. Below are the steps in creating an absence request. You can also view a tutorial at: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oyASUI9wNsU

- 1. Sign into Skyward Family Access using your assigned username and password. You will see the Family Access tile screen, where you can view tiles for all your students.
- Select the Attendance tile
 You can select a tile under a specific child's name or under the View All Students heading. If you
 wish to view a different child's information, you can do so by selecting that child's name at the
 top left of the screen.
- 3. Select the Absence Requests tab near the top of the screen on the left.
- 4. Under the Year-to-Date Absence Request heading, click Add Absence Request near the right of the screen.
- 5. The Add Absence Request Screen will appear. Complete the appropriate fields.
 - a. Verify the Start Date or enter the correct date if necessary.
 - b. Verify the End Date or enter the correct date if necessary.
 - Uncheck the box for All Day if appropriate
 If you left the box checked, skip to sub-step f
 If you unchecked the box, the Start Time and End Time fields display. Continue to sub-step d.
 - d. Enter the Start Time or click the Clock icon to enter the time.
 - e. Enter the End Time or click the Clock icon to enter the time.
 - f. Enter an Attendance Reason or click the Down Arrow icon to choose the reason. The only reason that is available to select is Parent Request. Select Parent Request.
 - g. Enter a Comment For example, if you wish to indicate that this request is due to vacation, you could enter Family Vacation.
- 6. Click Save near the top left of the screen to save your work. You will return to the Absence Request tab of the Student Attendance Screen. You can make modifications to the absence request using the Edit option if necessary. If the absence request is no longer needed, you can click Delete. Both options are located to the left of each absence request you enter.

Once the attendance request has been processed administratively, the Edit and Delete options are no longer displayed. You may also see a comment from the school in the School Comment column.


