I. CALL TO ORDER

President Vaughn Mester called the meeting to order at 7pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. Public Comments

IV. REPORTS

A. Activities Director

Brandon Wiese prepared a report. He stated that he is double checking athletic schedules for the upcoming season. He also congratulated the athletes that made All-Star Teams.

B. Student Services

Denise Brania prepared a report. She stated that she has had parents call about the upcoming school year. She also stated that she has started taking classes to become a School Psychologist.

C. Principal

Dana Bendorf prepared a report. She stated that the last student in credit recovery completed the requirement today.

D. Superintendent

Beau Buchs prepared a report. He stated the roof was completed yesterday with a third snow rail. The maintenance staff are moving along great with summer jobs and cleaning. He gave an update on the budget. Act20 training is going well for our elementary teachers. He also stated that he is working on the question that would be asked for the possible referendum. He would like to have a special meeting to discuss the referendum question with the board. He would like to possibly meet the week of August 12<sup>th</sup>. He also shared documents he received from the Association for Equitable Funding.

Lauren/Kim motion and second to approve the personnel transactions listed on the July 17, 2024 Personnel Transaction Sheet. Carried 7-0

C. After School Program Fees for 2024-25

BJ asked if we knew why enrollment has been lower. Mr. Buchs stated that he feels it is a vital program and we do have families that consistently use it.

Kim/BJ motion and second to set the After School Program fees at \$5/day, \$10 for an early release day, with a \$15 registration fee. Carried 7-0

D. Annual Athletic Pass Fees for 2024-25

Mr. Buchs recommends leaving the athletic pass fee at \$75. Admission prices per game are set by the conferences. They are:

MS Game Adult - \$2

MS Game Student - \$1

HS Game Adult - \$5

HS Game Student - \$3.

As a reminder, Belmont Students get free admission to home games.

Laura/Lauren motion and second to set the yearly athletic pass fee for the 2024-25 school year at \$75. Carried 7-0

E. Approval of the annual declaration and parent notice of the District's student academic standards that will be in effect for the 2024-2025 School Year pursuant to section 120.12(13) and section 118.30(1g)(a)1 of the state statutes

Pete/Vaughn motion and second to approve the annual declaration and parent notice of the district's student's academic standards for the 2024-25 School Year. Carried 7-0

F. Approval of Authorizing the Board's ability to borrow money for Operating the School District

Mr. Buchs stated that he does not anticipate the need to borrow money for operating expenses. If the need arises, he will communicate that with the board.

BJ/Laura motion and second to approve the ability of the district to borrow money for operating on the school district. Carried 7-0

G. Approval of Milk Bid for the 2024-2025 School Year

Our area only has one company that will give a milk bid, Prairie Farms. Lauren asked if a student brings in cold lunch are they able to purchase a milk. Mr. Wiese stated that students can pay for a single milk for \$0.25 or if available, get a milk from the share bin.

Lauren/Kim motion and second to approve the milk and dairy bid from Prairie Farms for the 2024-25 School Year. Carried 7-0

H. Approval of Bus Maintenance Bid for the 2024-2025 School Year

The district received one bid for bus maintenance. It has gone up slightly from last year due to supply price increases. The district has had to go to Shullsburg in the past for certain work when it cannot be done locally.

Pete/Vaughn motion and second to approve the Bus Maintenance Bid from TruckCo for the 2024-25 School Year. Carried 7-0

I. Approval of Title IX Policy #2264

He suggested that the board does not repeal our policy requiring two readings and make this the first reading of the policy. If he is told that the policy must be approved before August 1st or we will lose funding, he will let the board know. The board agreed that this would be the first reading.

#### VI. DISCUSSION ITEMS

##### A. Potential Referendum in November

Mr. Buchs prepared a presentation for the board. He is proposing that the district ask for \$550,000 for 4 years non-recurring. A resolution must be approved and filed by 8/27/24. He asks if the board has any suggestions or concerns of their own or of the community, to share them with him to possibly update the information. Kim stated that she would like to see some background information on the Mill Rate and other information that the community might not know exactly what those numbers entail. Mr. Buchs stated that it was a good suggestion and will look at possibly adding more information to the presentation.

I. CALL TO ORDER

A. Pledge of Allegiance: The meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

II. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Review Required Policy Changes

a) 2264 Title IX – Mr. Buchs explained that the updated Title IX policy is a mandated policy that will begin on August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. Mr. Buchs did report that 25 states have appealed the policy but Wisconsin is not one of them. Mr. Buchs also shared that the Moms of Liberty have filed an injunction to the policy in Wisconsin as well but the court has not ruled on the policy yet.

Mr. Buchs shared the main points that are changed from old policy #2266 and new policy #2264.

- Policy used to cover students but now covers staff and students.
- There is now a wider definition of discrimination and the definition of gender has changed.
- Cyberbullying is now covered 365 days a year and 24/7
- Out of school events need to be addressed by the school if reported.
- Reporting can be verbal now. A complaint in the past needed to be put in writing.
- WIAA still sets the policy on gender specific sports and currently only allows participation in the gender at birth.
- Staff will need to be trained on new policy as required.

Mr. Buchs shared that there is a lot of contention to the new policy but as of now, it is required to be in place on August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. Mr. Buchs shared that he will provide the board of education updates should this change.

III. Adjourn: The meeting was adjourned at 6:52 pm. Laura motioned, Vaughn seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

**DISTRICT MISSION:** Our mission is to prepare students so they can pursue their aspirations and contribute to the world in partnership with families and community.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

There were no public comments.

The Board accepted a resignation from Katie Droeszler and approved the hiring of Tori Nodolf as Asst. Volleyball Coach. The Board also approved the hiring of Paraprofessionals Jen Weigel & Rochelle Becker. Laura Bahr motioned to accept the personnel transactions as presented, Jamie Heinrichs seconded. Motion carried 7-0.

Laura Bahr read the resolution out loud. The Board of Education then approved a Resolution to Increase Revenue Limits for Operational Needs. Jamie Heinrichs motioned, BJ Galle seconded the resolution, motion carried 7-0.

Laura Bahr read the resolution out loud. The Board of Education then approved a Resolution Providing for a Referendum Election on the Question of the Approval of Resolution to Increase Revenue Limits. The question will be for 2024-2025, 2025-2026, 2026-2027, & 2027-2028 (4 years) The question on the November 5, 2024 ballot will ask for up to \$550,000 annually for the next four years. Mr. Buchs presented information that will also be shared at the Open House on August 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7:00 pm. Pete asked if we have a list of potential cuts if the referendum would fail. Mr. Buchs said we don't have a list set in stone but there would be a lot of difficult conversations to determine cuts. Mr. Buchs reminded the board that we have shopped for and changed health insurance to save money in the past few years. Jamie Heinrichs also shared that in order to have an effective school, we do have to spend money but do so wisely. BJ motioned, Vaughn Mester seconded to approve the resolution and the motion carried 7-0.

BJ motioned to adjourn at 7:36 pm, Pete seconded. Motion carried 7-0.

# Adding Absence Requests in Skyward Family Access

If your student is staying home from school, you can create an absence request in Skyward Family Access the morning of the absence. If you know your student will not be in school on a future date (ex. family vacation), you can create an absence request for a future date as well. Below are the steps in creating an absence request. You can also view a tutorial at: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oyASUI9wNsU>

1. Sign into Skyward Family Access using your assigned username and password.  
You will see the Family Access tile screen, where you can view tiles for all your students.
2. Select the Attendance tile  
You can select a tile under a specific child's name or under the View All Students heading. If you wish to view a different child's information, you can do so by selecting that child's name at the top left of the screen.
3. Select the Absence Requests tab near the top of the screen on the left.
4. Under the Year-to-Date Absence Request heading, click Add Absence Request near the right of the screen.
5. The Add Absence Request Screen will appear. Complete the appropriate fields.
  - a. Verify the Start Date or enter the correct date if necessary.
  - b. Verify the End Date or enter the correct date if necessary.
  - c. Uncheck the box for All Day if appropriate  
If you left the box checked, skip to sub-step f  
If you unchecked the box, the Start Time and End Time fields display. Continue to sub-step d.
  - d. Enter the Start Time or click the Clock icon to enter the time.
  - e. Enter the End Time or click the Clock icon to enter the time.
  - f. Enter an Attendance Reason or click the Down Arrow icon to choose the reason.  
The only reason that is available to select is Parent Request. Select Parent Request.
  - g. Enter a Comment  
For example, if you wish to indicate that this request is due to vacation, you could enter Family Vacation.
6. Click Save near the top left of the screen to save your work.  
You will return to the Absence Request tab of the Student Attendance Screen. You can make modifications to the absence request using the Edit option if necessary. If the absence request is no longer needed, you can click Delete. Both options are located to the left of each absence request you enter.

Once the attendance request has been processed administratively, the Edit and Delete options are no longer displayed. You may also see a comment from the school in the School Comment column.


