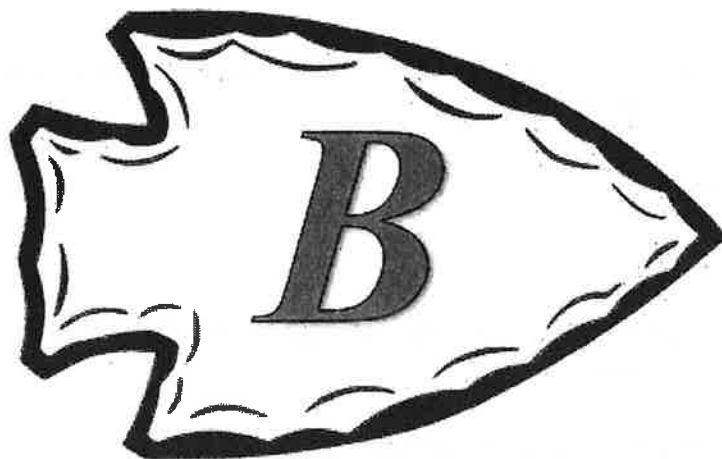

*In 2013-14, the Fund balance decreased by \$92,522 more than projected.

**In 2014-15, it decreased by \$62,699 more than projected.

In 2015-16, it decreased by \$42,823 more than projected.

****In 2016-17, it decreased by \$14,433 more than projected.

*****In 2017-18, it decreased by \$37,837 more than projected.

*****And in 2018-19, it decreased by \$43,745 less than projected.

The major factors for decreased expenditures include: staff changes after the budget was set, unpaid teacher "leave" time, employee changes from insurance option to in-lieu-of option, less online classes and more "in-house" classes, and fewer bus repairs than anticipated (all buses currently off-warranty).

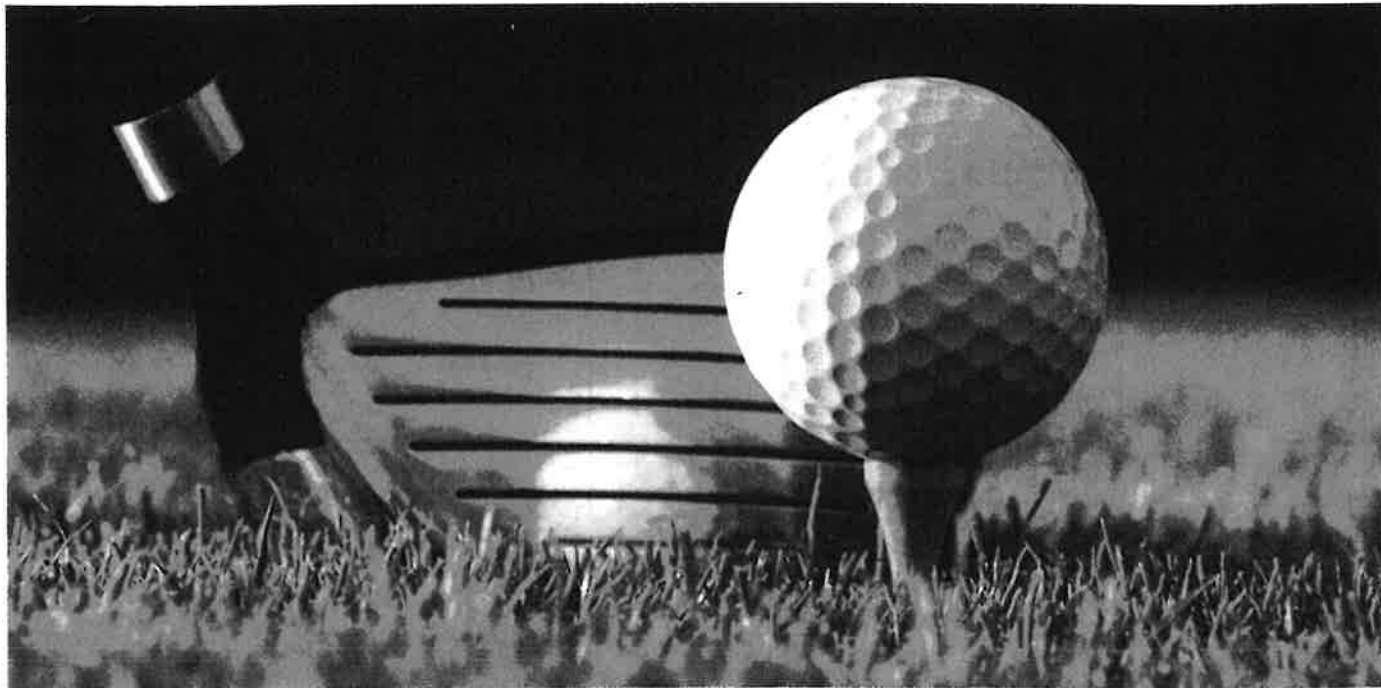

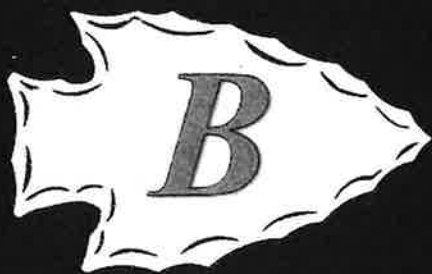
