I. CALL TO ORDER

President V. Mester called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

II. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None

III. REPORTS

- A. District Administrator – Dr. Anderson reported that inservice for the staff will start next week on Tuesday, August 25 through Thursday, August 27. This year, the District will be providing breakfast and lunch to the staff each day of inservice. He also reminded the Board that the Wisconsin Association of School Boards (WASB) will be holding virtual regional meetings this year. Our regional meeting will be on October 14 and the State School Board Convention will be held January 20 through January 22, 2021. At this time, we do not know whether this convention will be held in-person or virtual. Finally, Dr. Anderson reported that he will be contacting each Committee to set up its next meeting and agenda.
- B. Principal – Mr. Moyer reported that the Code of Conduct meeting would be held on Tuesday, August 18 at 6:00 p.m. on the football field. He also informed the Board that Schoology training would begin with the staff on Tuesday, August 18. This training is voluntary and staff members will be compensated for the day's training. Mr. Moyer informed the Board that he would be sending out a draft in-service schedule on Tuesday, August 18 and he will be working with Dr. Anderson and others to finalize the agenda. This fall, the District will have four (4) student teachers working with us and our Chromebooks and other technology has been ordered, but has still not arrived.
- C. Student Services – Ms Brania had prepared a written report for the Board. She reviewed the items on her report with the Board.

V. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Discuss Revised Title IX Policy

Dr. Anderson reported the new Title IX regulations have been a topic receiving a great deal of attention during the past months. The new Title IX regulations center on the how school districts will deal with complaints of sexual harassment and discrimination. One of the important parts of this policy will be the creation of a Title IX Coordinator. He will be working with Dr. Scott Brown from Neola to create a draft policy for the school district. Once the draft is completed, it will be reviewed and discussed at the Policy Committee and then brought to the full Board for discussion and eventual approval.

B. Update on Building Construction Project

Dr. Anderson informed the Board that the building project should be completed before the start of the school year with the possible exception of the Agriculture/Technology addition. Our maintenance/custodial staff is currently waxing the floors, repainting the lines in the park lots and doing some landscape work. Dr. Anderson also reported to the Board that the new roof appeared to have some leakage around the vents due to the hard rain. We are working with the contractors to find a solution to this problem.

C. Discuss Opening of School for the 2020-2021 School Year

The Board and administrators discussed the beginning of the school year. Dr. Anderson felt that this year would be a lesson in flexibility. He suggested two calendar changes for the beginning of the school year. The first change dealt with the Open House date on August 27. Dr. Anderson suggested changing the hours of that day from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and instead of having an Open House to set aside time from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. for students/parents to bring in school materials prior to

the first day of school, but not to be used to socialize with the teacher and classmates. Dr. Anderson and Mr. Moyer would be available to let parents into the building, who would not be able to get here by 5:00 p.m. His second suggestion dealt with the School – Community Fair. He has been informed that due to the coronavirus, the Fair has been greatly reduced and will consist mainly of an outside livestock show. He suggested that the calendar remain in place, but that teachers be given the option of how much they want to participate in this year’s activities.

Next, Dr. Anderson discussed the fall athletic season. He will be writing his next blog on this topic. He recommends playing fall sports and potentially purchasing the “huddle” system, which would allow our games to be live-streamed over YouTube, so that spectators could watch the events without having to come to the actual site. The approximate cost of this system would be \$3,600 for the first year and \$8,000 for the second year. This would cover the cost for our High School gym. Our elementary gymnasium could have an upgraded camera installed for about \$1,000, which would allow us to livestream events which occur in this gymnasium. Finally, we could livestream events on the football field by establishing a point-of-contact to the press box for approximately \$2,370. This upgrades would allow us to livestream not only sporting events, but also drama productions and concerts.

Finally, Dr. Anderson reported that at the end of the day 173 persons had chosen in-person instruction and ten (10) individuals had chosen virtual instruction. All families need to turn in their decisions by the end of the day on Tuesday, August 18.

Board members asked some specific questions concerning different aspects of the beginning of school and each question was discussed and answered using the current information that was available.

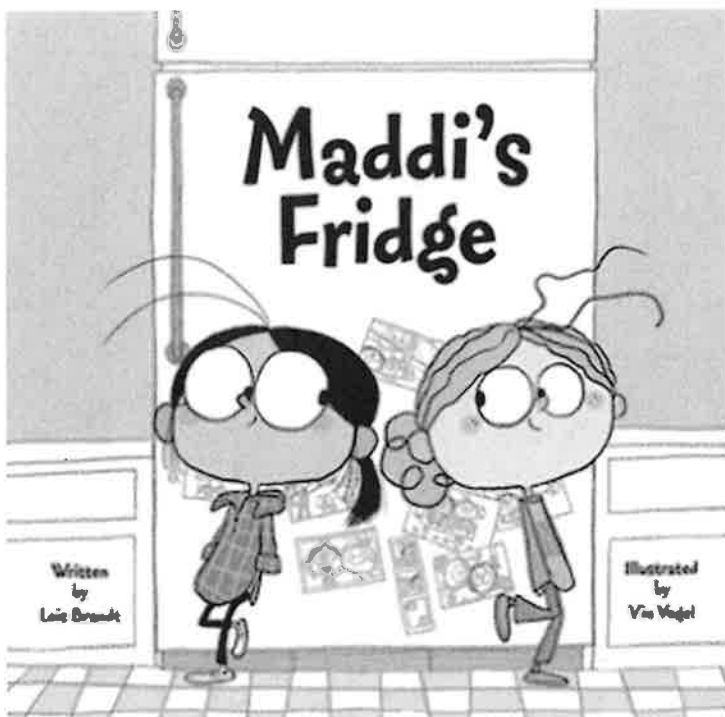
